Official airport and arrival information

Malta International Airport is the only airport in Malta and it serves the whole of the Maltese Islands. It is located on the island of Malta in the town of Luqa.

At the airport, Malta's Tourism Authority runs a helpful Tourist Information Desk in the Arrivals Hall. TECHNICAL INFORMATION

Technical Information Centre (TIC)

The Technical Information Centre (TIC) is located within the Technical Control Room at the competition venue (see Venue Set-up at ANNEX A).

The main function of the Competition Office) is to ensure smooth communication between each Team delegation, the Local Organisation Committee, Competition Management and the athletes regarding the technical matters.

The TIC will be open on competition day (14th June 2025), from 1 hour before the start of the first event of the day until at least 30 min after the publication of the last event's results or more in case of a protest.

The TIC is responsible for, but not limited to, the following:

- Display on the relevant notice board and electronic media of official communications to the teams, including start lists, results and Call Room reporting times
- Distribution of urgent notices to the delegations and athletes from the Technical Delegate and competition management will be issued from the TIC, and displayed on the Notice Board. It is the Team Leaders and Athletes' duty to view this kind of information in due time.
- Settlement of technical enquiries from delegations/athletes
- Receipt of Final Confirmations
- Managing national record doping control requests (if applicable)
- Receipt of withdrawal forms
- Written Appeals
- Payment and Receipt of any dues





Competition & Training Venue, Equipment & Implements Competition Venue

The Matthew Micallef St John Stadium and its surroundings are shown in ANNEX A of this document. The capacity of the stadium is 1500.

The stadium has the following competition sites:

- 8 lanes
- 1 High Jump site
- 1 Pole Vault site
- 4 sites for Long/Triple Jump
- 1 Shot Put Circles
- 1 Combined Discus/Hammer Circle
- 2 Javelin sites

The warm up area has the following sites:

- 8 lanes in a straight of 140m
- 1 site for Long Jump
- 1 Javelin site (on grass)
- 1 circle for shot
- 3 grass football pitches

Training Venue and Official Training at the Competition Venue

On Friday 13th June 2025 all athletes will have the possibility to train in the Matthew Micallef St John Athletics Stadium (main Stadium) and the adjacent warm-up area.

- Track Local and Foreign Athletes) 5.30pm to 7.30pm
- Block Starts for Sprinters 6pm to 7pm
- SLOTS FOR TRIPLE AND LONG JUMP will be available throughout

Equipment and implements necessary for training will be available at the training venue(s). Officials will be present to help in case of problems or special requirements. Borrowed implements / equipment must be handed back in to the Meeting Officials after use.

Participants who would like to make use of training facilities and equipment on days prior to the 13th June 2025, or after the day of the event, would need to seek a confirmation via the Organising Committee.





Entry System & Final Confirmations

Entry Procedures

Entries shall be made through the EAP Malta International online system which will be accessible via the official Meeting Website: https://www.eapmalta.com/

Final Entries

Final entries indicating the names and individual logistical information (detailed travel arrangements and accommodation request) of the competitors and of the officials must be received not later than 15 (fifteen) days before the competition day. According to the regulations the deadlines for the final entries are:

Withdrawals on the day of the event must be indicated to the TIC at the Stadium in writing on the official withdrawal form.

No refunds for paid Registration Fees will be given at any stage.





COMPETITION PROCEDURE

Timetable

Please refer to **ANNEX B** for the competition timetable.

Competition Bibs

Each competitor will receive 1 competition bib. The competition bibs are to be collected by the athletes as follows:

- Local Athletes are to collect their competition bib on Thursday 12th June 2025 as per instructions issued in a personal communication.
- Foreign Athletes are to collect their competition bib from Registration Office at the competition venue as soon as they arrive at the stadium on Saturday 14th June 2025 (competition day)
- No athletes will be allowed to participate in an event unless they are wearing their race bib.

Registration at Venue

There will not be any Technical Meeting held on the eve of the event.

ALL athletes are to present themselves at Registration Office at the Matthew Micallef St John Athletics Stadium at least 1 hour before the official Call Room Time, to confirm their participation.

The location of the Registration Office will be as indicated in **ANNEX A**

Competition Clothing

Competition Shoes & Dimensions of Spikes

All the competition shoes must comply with World Athletics TR5, including the sole and/or heel and the spikes dimensions. It is the athletes' responsibility to make sure that the shoes to be used for competition are on the current list of approved shoes models by the World Athletics (https://www.worldathletics.org/about-iaaf/documents/technical-information) In case of no compliance with the TR5 or the list of approved shoes, an athlete may be not allowed to compete or be disqualified after the competition with the result being void.

The shoes will be checked at the Call Room as the clothing items. In case of a world or European record, an athlete is to provide the used shoes to the competition officials, after the event, if further checks are needed.

W.A. Rule C2.1A – Athletics Shoe Regulations (effective from 01 January 2022)





Call Room

The Call Room is located at the far end of the Warm Up straight. Access will be allowed to athletes only and according to the following reporting times:

Event	Last call	Entrance to Infield
Track events(except hurdles)	20 minutes	10 minutes
Hurdles	25 minutes	15 minutes
High Jump	55 minutes	45 minutes
Pole Vault	75 minutes	60 minutes
Other field events	40 minutes	30 minutes

All times indicated above are prior to the actual starting time of the event.

Athletes who fail to report on time to the Call Room without a valid reason may be excluded from participating in this and all further events in the EAP Meeting, including Relays.

A dedicated, Event Call-up Schedule can be found in ANNEX C

At the venue this will be displayed close to the Call-Room Area

Refreshments (still water and sports drinks) will be available next to the Call Room.

Call Room Procedures

In the Call Room the judges will check the following in accordance with W.A. Rules:

- Competition Bibs
- · Shoes and Spikes
- Bags (identification of and content of)

Personal belongings such as electronic devices — including but not limited to video cameras, tape recorders, radios, CD players, radio transmitters, MP3/MP4 players, mobile phones, smartwatches, or similar equipment — are strictly prohibited in the infield, in accordance with World Athletics Rule 6.3.4 (formerly Rule 144.2).

World Athletics Technical Rule 6.3.2 further clarifies prohibited assistance: "Possession or use of video recorders, radios, CD, radio transmitters, mobile phone or similar devices in the competition area." This underscores that any device capable of communication or recording is not allowed within the competition area.

In Summary

- These are Permitted: Devices that function solely as heart rate monitors, speed/distance trackers, or stride sensors without any communication capabilities.
- These are Prohibited: Devices with communication features, such as smartwatches that can send/receive data, mobile phones, or any recording devices.





Competition officials in the Call Room are authorised to confiscate any unauthorised items. It is the sole responsibility of the athlete to ensure that such items are not brought to the Call Room or competition area. Any personal items should be left with a coach, teammate, or another trusted individual.

Specific Event Regulations

Competition Events

For any event to take place and be considered as a competition event a minimum of 4 participants must present themselves for the event on the day of the meeting.

In the case that on the day of the event less than 4 athletes present themselves for an event, then that particular event shall be considered as an Out of Competition Event. In such cases medals will be awarded in the following manner.

If only three athletes present themselves on the day of the event, only the 1st and 2nd placed athletes will be awarded with a medal.

If only two athletes present themselves on the day of the event, only the 1st placed athlete will receive a medal.

No medal will be awarded if only one athlete presents him/herself for an event.

Field Events except vertical jumps

All SENIOR participating athletes will have <u>three qualification trials</u> (1st, 2nd and 3rd trial). The **best 8 athletes in the Open Category** after the 3 qualification rounds will compete in another 3 rounds.

In the YOUTH (Under 16) Events, all participating athletes will each have 4 jumps.

The athletes eliminated after the third trial in the SENIOR CATEGORY will be ranked by their best performance after the 3rd qualification trial. The remaining 8 athletes in the SENIOR Category will be ranked by their best performance across all their 6 trials. In the case of a tie, World Athletics Rule TR32.2 (formerly 180.22) will be applied.

The time allowed for each attempt is one (1) minute, as per World Athletics Rule TR32.12 (formerly 180.17). The time permitted for each attempt shall be one (1) minute





Vertical Jumps (if applicable)

In the vertical jumps the World Athletics Rules shall be respected. Furthermore, each competitor is limited to a maximum of 3 (three) consecutive fouls throughout the whole field event.

The winner of the competition is allowed to continue according to World Athletics Rules.

The time permitted for each attempt in High Jump shall be one (1) minute except when consecutive attempts are by the same athlete or if only the winner is competing in which case World Athletics Rules shall apply.

Track events

In the track events the lane starting order will be determined by the Personal Best (PB) time of the athletes as indicated in the registration for the particular event and as verified by the Meeting Organisers. However, If the athlete's PB was registered in Year 2023 or before, the athlete's best results in the years 2024 and 2025 will be Taken into consideration for seeding purposes.. In the absence of any performance in 2024 or 2025, such athletes may be seeded at the discretion of the Meeting Organisers

No false start will be allowed. Any athlete committing a false start will be disgualified.

In case of a tie between athletes in the different heats for races up to 400m inclusively and relays, the photo finish judge shall consider the actual times to the 1/1000th of a second.

Determining Medal Winners in Track Events

A Gold Medal. A Silver Medal and a Bronze Medal will be awarded to the 1st, 2nd and 3rd placed athlete respectively in all the Open Male and Female, and the Youth Boys and Youth Girls events, as well as the Pre-Meeting U14 and U12 Sprint events..

In the case that the number of athletes in a particular event make it necessary for more than one heat to take place in the particular event, the medal winners will be determined after a general classification, including the performances attained in all the heats for the respective event, with the top 3 placed athletes being awarded with the medal in their order of merit. Similarly, Prize Money, will be given out to the top 4 classified athletes.

Allocation of Lanes in particular will be based on the athletes' results in 2024 and 2025. Otherwise allocation of lanes will be at the discretion of the organisers.





Starting Order in field events and Distribution of Athletes per heat in track events

The order of attempts in field events shall be in reverse order according to their Personal Best

However, in the triple jump event the order of attempts may be determined by the athletes' choice of the distance between the jumping board and the sand pit.

In the horizontal field events the order of trials in the first round will be kept for the first 3 trials. The order of the trials in the final round will be the reverse order of the ranking after the 3rd round.

Prize Money

EAP Malta International offers cash prizes as described hereunder;

Podium Prize Money

Podium Prize Money will a be given out as follows in those senior events which field at least a minimum of 5 participants in the WACT Challenger Events and at least 4 participants in the NON-Challenger Events.

WACT Challenger Events

1st Place - €400

2nd Place - €300

3rd Place - €200

4th Place - €100

NON-Challenger Events for Seniors

1st Place - €150

2nd Place - €100

3rd Place - €50

NEW EAP Record

A Prize Money of €400 will be awarded in the case that a **NEW EAP Record** is established during the Meeting.

NEW Meeting Record

A Prize Money of €50 will be awarded in the case that a **NEW Meeting Record** is established.

Awarding of Prize Money

WACT CHALLENGER EVENTS





In the case that on the day of the event less than 5 athletes present themselves for a WACT Challenger Event, then the awarding of Prize Money for that particular event will be carried out as follows;

If only 4 athletes present themselves on the day of the event, the Prize Money for 4th place will not be awarded

If only 3 athletes present themselves on the day of the event, the Prize Money for 3rd and 4th place will not be awarded

If only 2 athletes present themselves on the day of the event, the Prize Money for 2nd 3rd and 4th place will not be awarded

No Prize Money will be awarded if only one athlete presents him/herself for an event.

NON-WACT CHALLENGER EVENTS

In the case that on the day of the event less than 4 athletes present themselves for a WACT Challenger Event, then the awarding of Prize Money for that particular event will be carried out as follows:

If only 3 athletes present themselves on the day of the event, the Prize Money for 3rd place will not be awarded

If only 2 athletes present themselves on the day of the event, the Prize Money for 2nd place will not be awarded

No Prize Money will be awarded if only one athlete presents him/herself for an event.

Payment of Prize Money

Payment of Prize Money will be processed electronically within 30 days from the date of the meeting. In this regard winners of any Prize Money will receive a personal communication asking them to provide their bank details and IBAN number to which the transactions should be processed.





Specific Event Procedures

Track Events

According to the weather conditions, athletes may be asked to enter infield already dressed in competition clothes for races. In that case, baskets containing athletes' other clothing will be taken directly to the kit collection area at the Call Room.

Trials in Field Events

In the field events the official trials will be supervised by the judges. Athletes may only use the official markers provided by the LOC for the approach. These will be handed out by the competition officials at the competition area.

Once the trial jumps/puts are finished, the participants will be asked to stand in the order of the competition for the presentation.

Coaching Zones

To allow communication between athletes and coaches, identified areas will be provided close to the field events. (please see Venue Site Plan in ANNEX A).

For throwing events and High Jump (if applicable), the coaching seats will be located on the grass as indicated in the Venue Site Plan in ANNEX A. Coaches will have to meet at Call Room to be accompanied to the coaching zone.

Timing & Measurement

The official timing will be provided by ALGE Timing and will be displayed on the official electronic timing instrument and photo finish cameras provided by ALGE Timing. For all races of 800m or more, the elapsed time will be displayed on electronic timers located at the 200m and the finish.

Post Competition Procedures

After the competition, athletes leave immediately through the mixed zone. (Please see Venue Site Plan at ANNEX A)

The clothing baskets will be brought to the kit collection area located next to the mixed zone.

Protests and Appeals

Protests and appeals during the competition will be handled in accordance with World Athletics Technical Rule 8 (previously Rule 146).





In the first instance, protests must be made orally to the Referee by the athlete himself/herself or by someone acting on his/her behalf or by an official representative of a team (Rule 146.3). Only persons directly involved in the same round of the event may lodge a protest.

If the Referee is not readily accessible, the protest must be submitted via the Technical Information Centre (TIC).

Protests must be submitted within 30 minutes of the official announcement of the result, as posted at the TIC.

If the Referee's decision is not satisfactory, a written appeal may be submitted to the Jury of Appeal, again through the TIC, and within 30 minutes of the Referee's decision.

The appeal form must be signed by the athlete or an authorised team official and be accompanied by a deposit of €75.

This deposit will be forfeited if the appeal is unsuccessful.

The decision of the Jury of Appeal will be communicated in writing and is final

MEDICAL SERVICES

Medical Services

The medical service is in charge of any medical assistance to all accredited guests (Athletes, LOC personnel, VIP guests and media) as well as, during the competition, to the spectators in the stadium.

Below you can find information about the medical care sites and relevant instructions.

Please also see Venue Site Plan at ANNEX A

Medical Care at the Competition Venue

The stadium medical service is responsible for any problems concerning the athletes' health. There will be an ambulance for medical attention close to the finish line. The team doctor has access to the medical service facilities when an athlete of his/her own team is hurt or is in need of other medical attention.

The stadium medical service is also responsible for first aid in the warming up area.

Physiotherapy Services

Physiotherapy Services at warm-up and training venue(s)

There will be a well-equipped physiotherapy area that will include the availability of a LOC physiotherapist. The physiotherapy room will be open as follows:

Saturday 14th June 2025 15:00 – 20:00


